Eligibility Requirements:

Participants seeking to enrol in the CSQ funded Get Ready Program: MUST BE:

- A Queensland resident
- An Australian or New Zealand citizen or
- Permanent resident with a rights to work in Australia or
- A visa holder with rights to work in Australia

MUST NOT BE:

- An employee of an Authority
- An apprentice or trainee
- Permanently employed in the building and construction industry
- Currently enrolled in or have previously completed a Construction Skills Queensland
- Trade Ready Program
- A contracted Trainer or assessor or existing worker of an RTO
- Funded by an Authority or such other source for delivery of same training being undertaken as part of this Program

*Year 12 Students seeking to enrol in the CSQ funded Get Ready Program: Get Ready Program is only available to Year 12 students in Term 3 or 4 with approval from the school.

GET READY PROGRAM Frequently Asked Questions:



What is the CSQ funded "Get Ready" program?

The NICS, CSQ funded "Get Ready" Program provides industry-based training for career seekers in South East Queensland and other regional areas of Queensland. Providing a great foundation to progress into an apprenticeship, to build their job readiness and prepare them to transition into a career. Working on real work sites, participants have direct exposure to a variety of the "Wet Trades" and will learn from some of the most experienced professionals in their chosen industry.

What are the Wet Trades?

"Wet trades" in the construction industry encompass a range of skilled trades involving wet or liquid materials, including pain, mortar, plaster, and concrete. This category includes painting and decorating, wall and floor tiling, solid plastering, wall & ceiling lining and construction waterproofing. These trades are vital for building construction and finishing.

What is a Structured Workplace Learning Placement?

NICS will arrange one-week of structured work placement with employers that plan on hiring an Apprentice. This opportunity allows participants to demonstrate their suitability for the job.

How long is the course?

The program is expected to be completed in around 3 weeks.

What age requirements apply?

Participants must be over 16 years of age.

How much does it cost?

The course is funded by Construction Skills Queensland (CSQ) for eligible participants there is no charge to enrol in this course.

*Participants who successfully complete the Structured Work Placement will receive the White Card at no cost. If the placement is not completed, a fee of \$120 is required for the White Card, which will be issued upon payment.

- CPC3O620 Certificate III in Painting and Decorating
- CPC31O2O Certificate III in Solid Plastering
- CPC31220 Certificate III in Wall and Ceiling Lining
- CPC31320 Certificate III in Wall and Floor Tiling
- CPC31420 Certificate III in Construction Waterproofing



Do participants need a white card to enrol in this course?

No, you don't. It is one of the units that will be completed as part of the training in the second week.

*Participants who successfully complete the Structured Work Placement will receive the White Card at no cost. If the placement is not completed, a fee of \$120 is required for the White Card, which will be issued upon payment.

Are participants guaranteed a job or apprenticeship?

Participants are not guaranteed a job or apprenticeship. However, the program offers valuable training in work etiquette within the construction industry, life skills, resume writing, completing job applications, and interview techniques.

Do participants need a License?

Participants must hold the minimum of a Learner's License, with 25 hours completed and be able to show they are working towards 100 hours and gaining their license.

*During this program it will be the participants responsibility to organise transport to and from training and the work placement

Do participants need to have insurance on my Work Placement?

No, Insurance will be covered by NICS throughout the work placement



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
